

**2022 National Invitational  
55 & Over Mixed Doubles  
April 21-23, 2023, Scottsdale, AZ**

**Individual Player Waiver Requests:**

Individual eligibility waivers will not be accepted for the 2022 Mixed 55 & over National Invitational. Players that do not meet the match requirements will not be eligible to participate in the National Invitational.

**Team Waivers, READ THIS ENTIRE SECTION:**

For sections that are unable to produce at least 2 teams in local league play for any division, the Tournament Committee will allow those sections to form and send one team each as a representative of that section. Waivers must be submitted by the SLC by the deadline. Deadline to submit a team waiver is March 17, 2023.

Players or teams interested in participating in the Mixed 55 & Over team waiver program need to contact their SLC. Visit the [Mixed 55 & Over Invitational Website](#) to find your SLC's contact information. SLCs will submit the team captain's name and contact information to Kelly Ferris & Matt Gleason (Tournament Directors) and Brandon Buksbaum (USTA National Staff) by the deadline. Only teams submitted by a section's SLC will be considered for the Mixed 55 & Over Team Waiver Program.

Sections that have more than 2 teams are strongly encouraged to continue to hold and support local play in order to determine a winner for advancement from their section. Local and sectional play is determined by each section's SLC.

ANY TEAM coming via waiver must be comprised of at least 60% of at-level players. For example, a team made up primarily of 4.0 players is not an at-level 9.0 team. Teams that are receiving a waiver are limited to a maximum of 10 players.

ANY TEAM advancing directly to the National League Invitational via team waiver with no local or sectional play, may only have up to TWO (2) players from outside the section that they are representing at the National Invitational listed on their roster. A player's section residency association will be based on the player's listed section on their USTA account and the National Invitational Tournament Committee will verify those players' section residencies.
